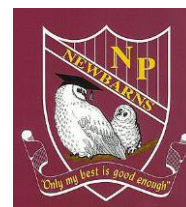

Sports Premium Funding Report – Analysis of Impact (Previous Full Year)

Our total funding allocation for last year was £19,570

- 96% of children participated in extra-curricular activities – either in school or through publicised and signposted activities elsewhere. (With the remaining few children being offered a place at a Change for Life Club.)
- Every child was offered at least one free session of a sport after school.
- In every class, the vast majority of children are working at or above the age related expectations for PE. (Detailed assessments are available.)
- Assessments of last year's Year 6 children (when they last swam in Year 5) show –
70% could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres - 42 out of 60 children (19 girls and 23 boys)
70% could use a range of strokes effectively – 42 out of 60 children (19 girls and 23 boys)
30% could perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations 18 out of 60 children (8 girls and 10 boys)
- Sustainability of improvements - "To ensure the government sports premium money allocated for the academic year improves provision of physical education (PE) and sport," will continue to be a target on the School Improvement Plan for this academic year.

Sports Premium Funding Report – (Current Year)

£19,550 in total is allocated this year.

Covid-19 restrictions permitting, we are planning to use this to enhance the quality and breadth of our PE provision for Newbarn's pupils by:

- Increasing participation in school sport by running additional after school PE clubs.
- Continuing the development of our Sports Councillors' expertise and skills.
- Increasing participation in school sport by funding and supporting structured play activities at lunch and break times.
- Hiring specialist coaches with exemplary knowledge and practical skills to work alongside class teachers to improve PE teaching and learning, ensuring a breadth of disciplines are covered, therefore ensuring all PE lessons are of the highest quality.
- Providing opportunities for more children to participate in sporting tournaments and fixtures.
- Providing quality supply cover to enable staff to support sporting events and tournaments.
- Ensuring that transport costs, where needed, are covered.
- Providing extra equipment (with a ten year guarantee) for children to play with at playtimes and lunchtimes.

We are confident that pupils will benefit as a result of this enhanced funding. Already, more children have been introduced to a wider range of sports through virtual events and in-school coaching. An analysis of the full impact on children's ability in physical education is completed annually. This shows an increase in the number of children achieving at or above age related expectations for their year group.
